

# ICAR y UDEFEGUA se unen para desarrollar una Línea de Base Nacional y apoyar la creación de un Plan Nacional de Acción sobre Empresas y Derechos Humanos en Guatemala

La Mesa Internacional para la Rendición de Cuentas Empresarial (ICAR, por sus siglas en inglés) y el Unidad de Protección a Defensoras y Defensores de Derechos Humanos - Guatemala ONG (UDEFEGUA) se han unido para desarrollar una Línea de Base Nacional (LBN) y promover la creación de un Plan Nacional de Acción (PNA) sobre empresas y derechos humanos en Guatemala.

Esta iniciativa es un proyecto de seguimiento al reporte seminal elaborado por ICAR con el Instituto Danés de Derechos Humanos (DIHR, por sus siglas en inglés) sobre los PNAs, titulado National Action Plans on Business and Human Rights: A Toolkit for the Development, Implementation, and Review of State Commitment to Business and Human Rights Frameworks<sup>[1]</sup> (disponible en inglés solamente), lanzado en junio del 2014.

Este proyecto de nueve meses apoyará la generación y finalización de una LBN de la implementación actual de los marcos internacionales de empresas y derechos humanos en Guatemala. Utilizando los datos recogidos en la LBN, el proyecto identificará recomendaciones y áreas prioritarias para un posible PNA guatemalteco y el proceso a seguir para su desarrollo.
